

I keep Hedda warm

doll sweater by MayaB

Yarn

The picture shows this sweater made in *Free Style* by Dale of Norway/Dalegarn, colorway 5072. The amount of yarn required is one ball of 88 yards/50 grams. However, any kind of wool yarn will do as long as the gauge is the same.

Needles

A set of 5 double pointed needles and short circular needle, size US 8 (5 mm).

Extras

Darning needle, a stitch holder, four large safety pins, and some scrap yarn for the letters.

Gauge

20 sts = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette stitch.

Measurements

One size, chest 6 3/4" (17 cm), sleeve 3 1/4" (9 cm).

Skills

Knitting in the round, picking up stitches, Kitchener and Duplicate stitch.

Pattern notes:

Garner stitch in the round:

First round, knit every stitch. Second round, purl every stitch. Repeat for garter stitch in the round.

Stockinette stitch in the round:

First round, knit every stitch. Repeat for stockinette stitch in the round.



INSTRUCTIONS

BODY

CO 64 sts using the circular needle. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist stitches. Work four rounds in garter stitch.

Knit 25 rnds in Stockinette stitch

Divide for front and back by placing the last 32 sts you knitted on a stitch holder.

BACK

ROW 1 (RS): k2tog tbl, k 28, k2tog, turn

ROW 2: p2tog, p 26, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 3: k2tog tbl, k 24, k2tog, turn

ROW 4: p2tog, p 22, p2tog tbl, turn = 24 sts

ROW 5 - 12: continue working in St st

RIGHT BACK SHOULDER

ROW 13: k 10, k2tog, turn, placing remaining 12 sts on a safety pin to be worked on later.

ROW 14: p2tog, p 9, turn

ROW 15: k 8, k2tog, turn

ROW 16: p2tog, p 7, turn

ROW 17: k 6, k2tog, turn

ROW 18: p2tog, p 5, turn

ROW 19: k 6, turn

ROW 20: p 6

Place last 6 sts on a safety pin, cut the yarn leaving a long tail which you can use to sew the shoulders together or weave in later.

LEFT BACK SHOULDER

Join yarn

ROW 13: k2tog tbl, k 10, turn

ROW 14: p 9, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 15: k2tog tbl, k 8, turn

ROW 16: p 7, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 17: k2tog tbl, k 6, turn

ROW 18: p 5, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 19: k 6, turn

ROW 20: p 6

Place last 6 sts on a safety pin, and cut the yarn leaving a long tail which you can use to sew the shoulders together or weave in later.

FRONT

Place 32 sts from the stitch holder back to circular needle (your dpn might be too short).

Join yarn

ROW 1 (RS): k2tog tbl, k 28, k2tog, turn

ROW 2: p2tog, p 26, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 3: k2tog tbl, k 24, k2tog, turn

ROW 4: p2tog, p 22, p2tog tbl, turn = 24 sts

RIGHT FRONT

ROW 5: k 12, turn, placing remaining 12 sts on a safety pin to be worked on later.

ROW 6: p 12 sts, turn

ROW 7 - 12: continue working in St st

ROW 13: k 10, k2tog, turn

ROW 14: p2tog, p 9, turn

ROW 15: k 8, k2tog, turn

ROW 16: p2tog, p 7, turn

ROW 17: k 6, k2tog, turn

ROW 18: p2tog, p 5, turn

ROW 19: k 6, turn

ROW 20: p 6

Place last 6 sts on a safety pin, cut the yarn leaving a long tail which you can use to sew the shoulders together or weave in later.

LEFT FRONT

Join Yarn on RS

ROW 5 - 12: work remaining 12 sts in St st

ROW 13: k2tog tbl, k 10, turn

ROW 14: p 9, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 15: k2tog tbl, k 8, turn

ROW 16: p 7, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 17: k2tog tbl, k 6, turn

ROW 18: p 5, p2tog tbl, turn

ROW 19: k 6, turn

ROW 20: p 6

Place last 6 sts on a safety pin, cut the yarn leaving a long tail which you can use to sew the shoulders together.

Using Kitchener stitch, graft shoulders together, and weave in all loose ends.



SLEEVES (make 2)

Join yarn on RS

Using dpn, start in the armpit, and pick up a total of 28 sts. Place approximately an equal number of stitches on each needle. I use 5 needles knitting in the round on dpn, some use four. You decide what you prefer.

Rnd 1 - 3: work in St st

Rnd 4: k 1 sts, k2tog, k 22, k2tog, k 1 sts

Rnd 5 - 7: work in St st

Rnd 8: k 1 sts, k2tog, k 20, k2tog, k 1 sts

Rnd 9 - 11: work in St st

Rnd 12: k 1 sts, k2tog, k 18, k2tog, k 1 sts

Rnd 13 - 15: work in St st

Rnd 16: k 1 sts, k2tog, k 16, k2tog, k 1 sts = 20 sts

Rnd 17 - 21: work in St st

Rnd 22 - 25 start working in purl and work four rounds in garter stitch

BO remaining 20 sts knitwise

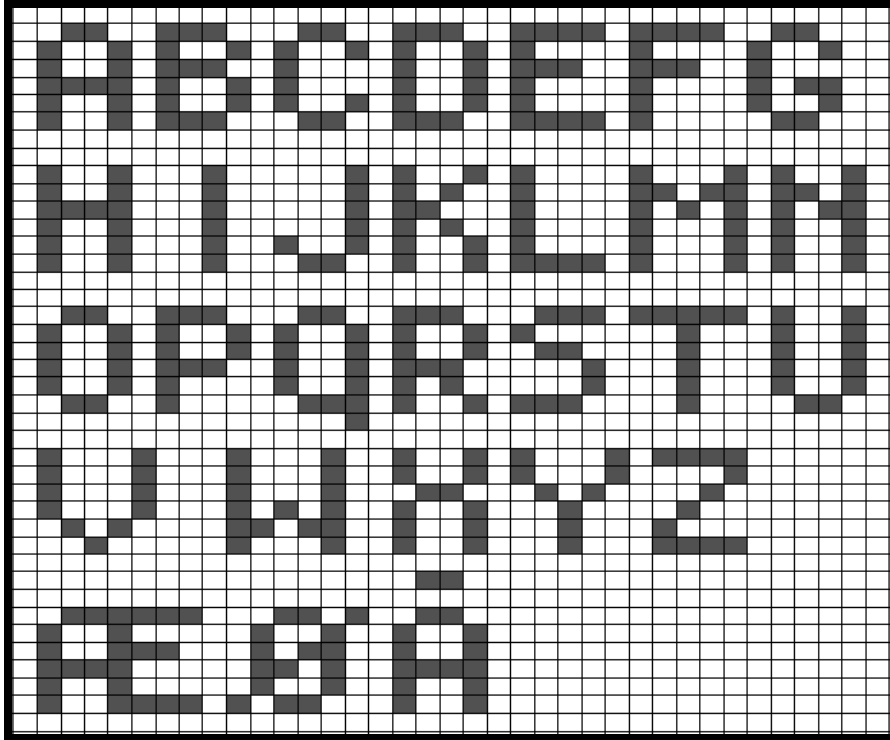
Make the other sleeve the same way.

FINISHING

Weave in remaining ends.

Following the chart below make any doll's name using Duplicate stitch. For my Norwegian readers I've included the Norwegian letters.

If you wish you can crochet a round of chain stitches around the neckline to make it more defined. Remember to do this very loosely and use a hook in a larger size to prevent the neckline from turning out too tight.
